Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 125): What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we are glad.

Gospel Reflection by Fr. Alex

This Sunday we continue to reflect on the passage from Mark. In this story we see that Bartimaeus (Blind Man) received a miraculous healing from Jesus as an answer to his pleading. There, shouting and begging at the side of the road amongst others, undignified and desperate indeed caught Jesus attention specially that of Bartimaeus; "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." But it was a sincere cry for help from his soul. In this instance, Jesus emphasized that Bartimaeus's enthusiasm to reach out has saved him. Jesus healing power has a direct correlation with someone's faith seeking for help.

The presence of Jesus in our lives are still in question for most of us, mentally accepted but not spiritually embraced. Perhaps because we want tangible and instant results from all our requests. Having said that my friends. Did, Jesus have ever neglected and rejected our prayers? I think the answer is never! As he is our loving God and compassionate Father who is always ready to help.

How complex it is to talk to Jesus? The answer is, not complex at all. All we must do is to reach out to Him in prayer and we can be assured that He will hear us. Tell him what your heart desires most, what your needs are and then, like Bartimaeus did, seek for him. Rest assured it would be life filled with happiness; wrapped with purpose; entangled with eternity.

Lastly, let us revisit our relationship to God. In relation to our needs and sufferings; expectations and petitions. Does your faith weaken if your prayers and petitions not answered immediately or He still your GOD, your truth and your saviour? AMEN.
